



The Journal of Cleaning Science Contributor Guidelines

Thank you for your interest in submitting a paper to *The Journal of Cleaning Science*, a peer-reviewed technical journal that publishes twice a year. The focus is on research that helps professionals quantify and measure clean in a variety of settings.

Papers should be original research or technical papers that clearly state the problem or issue being researched, the methodology used, the results achieved, an analysis of the information gathered, the conclusions reached and how they are supported. They should be written by an actual authority (or authorities) and not via artificial intelligence.

Highlight novel aspects of the results, their significance, improvements or changes they suggest and issues they solve or address. A brief abstract or bullet points summarizing highlights of the paper may be helpful for readers.

Subheads, footnotes and references should be included as necessary. Consider sidebars or bullets to highlight key points or information. Illustrations, graphics, photographs or tables to help depict data or conclusions may be included and should be high resolution (300 dpi or higher).

Papers should be submitted as Word documents. The ideal length is 2000-3000 words, which includes references, footnotes and sidebars.

Once a paper has been submitted and accepted for publication, it will be edited and submitted to a panel of subject-matter experts for peer review. Any substantive questions or comments will be shared with the author for review and response. If they are unable to be resolved, the editor will be the final arbiter of the content. If the author chooses not to accept the editor's decision, the author may withdraw the paper from publication. The review and editing process generally takes 8-10 weeks.

Authors should include a 3-5 sentence professional bio, email address and a headshot with their paper.

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
